Guidelines for contributors:

Submission and publication:

1. All manuscripts should be submitted to the members of the editorial board. Please send your manuscript as an electronic file.
2. The editors welcome manuscripts in English and German.
3. Please note that all manuscripts are reviewed by one or two senior scholars.
4. Authors are responsible for obtaining permissions from copyright holders for reproducing any illustrations, tables, figures or lengthy quotations previously published elsewhere.
5. The Working Paper Series is a preprint series. All rights are left with the author. The editors would be grateful to be informed about further publication.
6. The Working Papers will be published electronically and can be downloaded from the website of the Department of Methods in Social Sciences (mesos.univie.ac.at). The authors receive 5 printed copies.

Styleguide:

1. The title page with the author's name, full title and subtitles should contain an abstract of not more than 200 words.
2. The main text body should be in block style.
3. The text should be clearly organized with a clear hierarchy of headings and subheadings.
4. The main title should be in Times New Roman 14 pt, bold. Chapter headings should be in Times New Roman 12 pt, bold. All subtitles should be italicized and in Times New Roman 12 pt. Title and headlines should be capitalized but only before the first punctuation mark.
5. Pages should be numbered consecutively starting with the title page. Numbers should be in the right hand top corner.



6. On the title page, the author name (in italics) should contain a footnote with current institutional affiliation of the author and email address. Acknowledgement should also be mentioned here.
7. Articles shall be printed in 1 1/2 space on one side only, with a 3 cm margin on the left hand and a 2 cm margin on all other sides. Foreign words should be italicized.
8. References within the text should be cited in the following form:
(Barnes 1954: 27, Johnson & Margolin 1990: 245-247, Kennedy et al 1994: 5, Baxter 1982 quoted in Comaroff 1988: 6).
9. Bibliography should be cited as follow:
Edited volumes: Sharma, Aradhana, and Akhil Gupta (ed.). 2006. *The Anthropology of the State: A Reader*. Malden, MA: Blackwell Publishing.
Monographs: Augé, Marc. 1995. *Non-Places: An Introduction to Supermodernity*. London: Verso.
Book chapters: King, Viktor. 1996. Sociology. In *An Introduction to Southeast Asian Studies* (eds.) Halib Mohammed and Tim Huxley. London and New York: Tauris Publisher, 148-188.
Journal articles: Emirbayer, Mustafa, and Jeff Goodwin. 1994. Network Analysis, Culture, and the Problem of Agency, *American Journal of Sociology* 99:6, 1411-1454.
10. Footnotes should be kept to a minimum and must be numbered consecutively throughout the text.
11. Tables, maps and illustrations should be on a separate page, numbered and with headings. Please indicate in the text where they should appear.
14. When referring to websites, the citation should start with <http://>. Please also indicate the date you visited the site.
