In the FWF-funded project "Enacting (digital) citizenship from below: A study on care and the uses of digital infrastructure by refugees in Bosnia and Herzegovina", a research team at the Department of Social and Cultural Anthropology is investigating the role of digital infrastructures for refugees at the EU's external border, in Bosnia and Herzegovina. How do refugees at the borders of the EU care for themselves and others through digital infrastructure? How does this shape their political subjectivities and hold potential to enact citizenship from below?
