Drawing on our experiences in the Bachelor program in Cultural and Social Anthropology, we critically examine the “Politics of Attention” as it relates to our methodological training. We observe that decolonial and feminist research approaches are frequently sidelined, and that researchers who are not able-bodied, white, cisgender and male often encounter challenges—such as discrimination and accessibility barriers—that rarely get acknowledged within academic settings. In this context we focus on autoethnography, highlighting it as an underrepresented, potentially valuable method for researchers to explore their own marginalized experiences. Our presentation will begin with a brief introduction to autoethnography, followed by three perspectives:

Vinzenz will discuss the method's application for trans and queer reflections on masculinity.

Emi will address its historical development within Black feminist thought.

Noah will offer reflections on the politics of disability within research contexts.

Through this exploration, we aim to advocate for a more inclusive and diverse methodological approach in our academic training.
