Sarah Mazouz (French National Centre for Scientific Research) The Unspoken and the Speakable: Race in a Colorblind Context



Sarah Mazouz completed a PhD in sociology at the École des Hautes Études en Sciences sociales (2010) and is tenured researcher at the

CNRS. Her main research topics are antidiscrimination, race, and racialisation in France and in other European countries, as well as citizenship politics in France and Germany. Drawing on ethnography, her work leans on critical race theory, sociology of law, sociology of public policies and critical anthropology of moral.

Drawing on my research led mainly in France and to some extent in other countries of Mainland Europe (Germany, Spain and Sweden), I will address in this presentation the debates on race and racialisation in the French context. How are these debates structured and what are their consequences for the implementation of polices against racial discrimination as well as for the understanding of political demands made by racial minorities. I will try to place the French case in the context of continental Europe, while showing what is specific about the republican framework. Finally, I will return to the epistemological advantages of working critically on race in a social and political context that is hostile to making these issues explicit.
