She has authored numerous papers, including "Women's Political Representation in Indonesia: Who Wins and How?" and "Adversarial Linkage: The Urban Poor Politics and Electoral Politics in Jakarta" in the *Journal of Current Southeast Asian Affairs*. She has held research positions in Australia and the Netherlands, holds a doctorate at the Universiteit van Amsterdam, and is a visiting researcher at the University of Vienna from 5 to 13 November 2024.

The book *Governing Urban Indonesia* (2024) examines how urbanisation is remaking Indonesia and how governments are responding. It focuses on how varied political patterns are shaping urban governance, enabling some cities to pioneer improved service delivery and better public amenities for their citizens, while others stagnate. And it brings to bear multiple perspectives on how historical legacies, changing residential patterns, social inequality and myriad other factors are combining to produce a new social and political landscape across urban Indonesia.



Indonesia has become a majority urban society. Urbanisation has brought with it a familiar range of problems which pose massive challenges to Indonesian governments as they try to provide clean water, public transport, housing, garbage disposal and other services to urban dwellers.
